Commentary Critical and Explanatory on the Whole Bible

Colossians 4:10

10. Aristarchus—a Macedonian of Thessalonica (Ac 27:2), who was dragged into the theater at Ephesus, during the tumult with Galus, they being "Paul's companions in travel." He accompanied Paul to Asia (Ac 20:4), and subsequently (Ac 27:2) to Rome. He was now at Rome with Paul (compare Phm 1:23, 24). As he is here spoken of as Paul's "fellow prisoner," but in Phm 1:24 as Paul's "fellow laborer;" and vice versa, Epaphras in Phm 1:23, as his "fellow prisoner," but here (Col 1:7) "fellow servant," MEYER in ALFORD, conjectures that Paul's friends voluntarily shared his imprisonment by turns, Aristarchus being his fellow prisoner when he wrote to the Colossians, Epaphras when he wrote to Philemon. The Greek for "fellow prisoner" is literally, *fellow captive*, an image from prisoners taken in warfare, Christians being "fellow soldiers" (Php 2:25; Phm 1:2), whose warfare is "the good fight of faith."

Mark—John Mark (Ac 12:12, 25); the Evangelist according to tradition.
